CME on rabies:

The department of community medicine had conducted a CME on rabies on 5th April,2011 at the seminar hall,6th floor, KIMSH&RC, Bangalore. About 30 people including doctors ,postgraduate & Interns had participated in the programme.

World Health Day-2011:

6th term students made presentations on the world health day theme 2011 – Safe Lives, Make Hospitals safe in Emergencies at Lecture hall-2, KIMS Banashankari college campus,Bangalore on 25.04.2011. About 120 students from 6th term participated. The staff ,postgradautes & Interns of the department of community medicine were present. The presentation was followed by distribution of certificates to the students & discussion on the subject.

World Rabies Day, 28th September, 2011:

On the occasion of World Rabies Day 2011, the department had organized a one day CME on Rabies for Undergraduates, Interns and Postgraduates of KIMSH&RC, Bangalore. A technical video and public video was screened to about 200 people. This was followed by discussion .

One Health Experiment - A rural rabies prevention project : Successful completion of the two year project.

One Health experiment- A rural rabies prevention project was successfully completed on 30th November,2011. The project was for a period of two year (1st December,2009 to 30 th november,2011.

The medical ,veterinary ,laboratory and animal welfare professionals had come together for the first time anywhere in the world in a novel project for the prevention and control of rabies in a rural community with the concept of **– One Health**.

This project was a joint effort of the Global Alliance for Rabies Control (GARC), Rabies in Asia (RIA) Foundation Commonwealth Veterinary Association (CVA), Department of Community Medicine, KIMS, Bangalore, Department of Veterinary Pathology, Government Veterinary College, Bangalore and Department of Neurovirology, National Institute of Mental Health Neurosciences (NIMHANS), Bangalore.

The incidence of rabies, dog/animal bite was found to be lower than the national averages after the implementation of the one health experiment. The project was able to demonstrate that the different stake holders can come together and work as a team for a common cause.

The final report of the project was presented at varies national and international conferences and was very well accepted for replication in other places.

The project team would like to thank the school teachers, school children, volunteers, anganwadi workers, ASHAs, SHG members, MO-PHCs, Government veterinarians, local leaders along with the department medical and health staff, postgraduates & interns who had contributed to the success of the project in the field.

Memorandum of Understanding between Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences Bangalore, India and The San Antonio School of Medicine, University of Texas Health Science Center, Texas, USA:

The Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore (Department of Medicine and Department of Community Medicine) and University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio School of Medicine (UTHSCSASOM) have a memorandum of understanding for academic study purpose a observership student exchange program.

In this regard two students Mr. Brent W Thiel and Miss Toral J Parikh were in KIMS, Bangalore for a period of three weeks from 06/02/2012 to 25/02/2012.

The students were posted in community medicine for one week duration during which the students observed the activities of the Rural health Training Centre, Kengeri, Urban Health Training Centre, Parvathipura, Preventive Medicine Unit, KIMSH&RC and Government Health Facilities.

Health Examination and Health Education Sessions to School Children and women:

Interns and post graduate students from the Department of Community Medicine, Kempegowda Institute of Medical Science, Bangalore, in collaboration with Lions club, J P Nagar, Bangalore had conducted School Health Examination and health education sessions to the school children of Government boy's and girl's high schools, and also to women and children living in a few NGOs situated in bangalore urban, during the period July-November, 2011.

A total of 15 schools were visited. About 5000 children were screened ,treated and referred appropriately. Information on issues like adolescent health problems was addressed by doctors in the local language. This was followed by interactive question and answer sessions.

Similarly a total of about 10 sessions was conducted for women and children living in the NGO centre. Health examination, appropriate treatment and referral was given. Counseling was also given to the needy women.

One Health Experiment - Visit of staff from Centre for Disease Control (CDC) ,Atlanta ,USA,11th,October,201.

Miss Lillian Ann Orciari from the rabies unit, CDC, Atlanta had visited the department of community medicine, KIMS, Bangalore on 11th October, 2011.

She was briefed about the one health experiment activity of the department at the seminar hall. This was followed by discussion on the subject.

Evaluation of MDA programme-Filariasis: Dakshina Kanada, 13th-20th, February, 2011:

The department of community medicine was involved in the in the evaluation of Mass Drug Administration of Filariasis and collection of information on malaria in Dakshin Kannada district, Karnataka from 15th -18th, February, 2012 for Office of Health & Family Welfare(ROHFW), Bangalore. Dr Giriyana Gowda, Assistant Professor, the team along lead postgraduates Dr M R Satish Chandra and Dr S Rekha.

Pulse Polio Immunization Programme - NID rounds of 19th-22nd February, 2012.

In this historic year as the country celebrates one year being free from polio, the department takes immense pleasure in being one of the countless , who have contributed to the success of the polio eradication programe.

Preventive Medicien Unit (PMU), KIMSH&RC- Clincial Trials

The PMU successfully conducted and completed a good number of Phase –III & IV clinical trials on vaccines and immunoglobulins on rabies and other diseases. Similarly the

Allergy unit was also very active with rush immunotherapy during the year.

CME on Polio Update and Acute Flaccid Paralysis (AFP) Surveillance was conducted at the Auditorium,6th floor, KIMS Hospital& Research Centre, Bangalore on 9th March 2012 at the . Dr. B P Subramanya, Surveillance Medical Officer (SMO), WHO-NPSP, Bangalore Unit was the Guest Speaker.

The programme was organised by Department of Community Medicine and Dr. Giriyanna Gowda, Assistant professor coordinated the CME. About 150 staff and post graduates from department of Paediatrics, Medicine, Community Medicine, Orthopaedics, Physiotherapy, Nursing staff and Medical Record section staff had attended.

Dr. M K Sudarshan, Dean and Principal KIMS presided over the function. The main focus of the lecture was to involve the other departments so as to strengthen the AFP surveillance .This was followed by question answer session.
